San Luis Obispo Sheriff's Office Breaching for Patrol Expanded Course Outline 2-Hour Course

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

This course is designed to familiarize deputies with the use of Halligan tools and rams, legal standards of use (Lexipol 322, 414, 424), and proper breaching methods.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The student will learn the descriptions of the breaching tools and methods, as well as the legal standards of forcing entry. They will be taught how to properly use the tools, including position, stance, and tactical concerns. Students will be given a case debrief of a patrol-based hostage situation where forced entry was applied. Students will receive hands on training with vehicle window breaching with batons, use of a ram on inward opening doors, and use of a Halligan with and without a ram on outward opening doors.
